It invites discussion about language, different text formats and making writing fun. The workshop could involve the class performing the play.</p>

Students will brainstorm ways to include others in their play activities. They will talk about the colours of the rainbow, and draw a picture using these colours.</p>
<p><b>Tom's Dare/Harry's Goldfield Adventure</b></p> <p><b>Tom's Dare</b></p>  <p>Kitty is desperate to go to school, and Tom hates school and would rather fossick for gold. So when their father goes missing and their mother is forced to go out to work, Tom dares Kitty to swap roles.</p> <p><b>Harry's Goldfield Adventure</b></p> <p>When Harry falls down an old mine shaft at his aunt's house, he is taken back in time to the goldfields. They will specifically look at the discovery of gold in Australia and how family and school life has changed over time.</p>

They will then create their own acrostic rainbow poems</p>

<p><b>Hope for Hannah</b></p>  <p>Hanna lives in a small village in Uganda, Africa, with her mother and sisters. Her father has left and Hanna must look after her sick mother. But how will Hanna manage if her mother doesn't get better? They will discuss resilience, resourcefulness and empathy.</p>

What are heroism stereotypes? Can anyone be a hero? Do heroes have flaws?</p> <p>As well as discussing answers to these questions, students will be introduced to narrative non-fiction and its ability to combine fact and fiction.</p>
